
## Puppet Theatre

To make a Rala Rwdins Puppet Theatre you will need:


- ★ A large, empty cereal box or similar
- ★ Poster paint and a paint brush
- ★ Old newspapers - to protect the surface from paint and glue
- ★ Coloured crêpe paper or scraps of fabric - for the theatre curtains
- ★ Scissors - REMEMBER TO ASK AN ADULT FOR HELP WHEN USING SCISSORS
- ★ A pencil or felt pen
- ★ Glue




Cut the top off your cereal box.  
This will become the bottom of your theatre.



Use the old newspapers to protect the surface .  
Now paint the box with the poster paint.  
Let your theatre dry completely.



Cut a rectangular hole on one side of the box.  
This will become the stage for your theatre.





Draw your curtains onto crêpe paper and cut around them. You can also use 2 rectangular scraps of fabric as curtains.



Glue the curtains to the front of your theatre.  
Use the Rala Rwdins puppets to put on a show for your friends and family.




## Theatre Puppets

To make Rala Rwdins Theatre Puppets you will need:


- ★ Several sheets of A4 card - 1 sheet for each set of puppets
- ★ Coloured pencils, felt pens or paints - if you are colouring your puppets
- ★ Old newspapers - to protect the surface from paint and glue
- ★ Scissors - REMEMBER TO ASK AN ADULT FOR HELP WHEN USING SCISSORS
- ★ Lollypop sticks or similar - 1 stick for each puppet
- ★ Glue




Glue the puppet shapes onto a thin sheet of card.  
If you are colouring in your puppets then do so now.




Carefully cut around both sides of the puppet shapes.



Now take the front part of your puppet's body and  
glue a lollypop stick to the back of it. Leave enough  
stick to hold on to.





Take the back part of your puppet and glue to the  
front part. Make sure that the lollypop stick is in  
the middle of the two body pieces.



Once the glue has dried your puppets are ready to  
perform in your theatre. Have fun making up stories.


## Theatre Backgrounds

To add background scenes to your Puppet Theatre you will need:


- ★ Print outs of the theatre backgrounds from the website
- ★ Poster paint, coloured pencils or felt pens
- ★ Old newspapers - to protect the surface from paint
- ★ Scissors - REMEMBER TO ASK AN ADULT FOR HELP WHEN USING SCISSORS
- ★ Sticky tape




Use the old newspapers to protect the surface.  
Colour in the scenes with paint, pencils or pens.




Once all the scenes are coloured in, join them  
together with sticky tape along the side edge.



Now take your theatre and cut 2 slits down each  
side of the box at the back of your theatre.



Carefully slide the scenes through the slits on  
either side of your theatre.



When you want to change the scene in your  
theatre just pull the new scene into shot.
