Stunning Welsh homes raise the roof!

Caernarfon, Anglesey and Cardiff are the stop offs for presenter Aled Samuel and designer Mandy Watkins in this episode of **Dan Do**, to enjoy the best views inside and outside some of the most delightful homes in Wales.

"Between the floor and ceiling, the house and the dream home, there's plenty to entertain you this week," says Aled Samuel.

Starting in a traditional Welsh cottage in Anglesey, Aled is mesmerised by the welcoming red gate of Pen y Gamfa.

"There's something about a Welsh cottage, no fuss at all. Door in the middle, a window either side, crog loft and a welcoming fire," says Aled Samuel.

Home to Ian Keith and his partner Gemma, they've managed to put their own stamp on the cottage, giving this cottage a new lease of life.

"We saw the red door, and we had to see more!" says Ian.

Combining the old with the new, Melin Tregwynt's furnishings and blankets are a nod to its Welshness, while the eco extension at the back of the cottage resembles a Swedish sauna!

Down south, a big yellow Victorian door welcomes Mandy on the outskirts of Cardiff, home to Stacey and her family. A Victorian house with modern touches inside, Stacey hasn't been shy using colour, bold patterns and textures.

Stacey says: "It was a blank canvas when we moved in...before moving into this house I hadn't experimented with colours and bold patterns but it was something I always wanted to try. I like flowery patterns, dark colours, a Victorian moody vibe with a modern twist!"

Her bold and adventurous design is everywhere throughout the house, in particular the dark kitchen and its industrial feel, while a large copper bath is the house's crowning glory.

Last stop for Aled and Mandy is Caernarfon, to visit Bryn Helen, Gwen and Jim's Georgian home. Boasting an amazing view of Caernarfon Castle, Mandy and Aled have passed this house numerous times over the years and have been itching to see what it's like inside. Mandy wasn't disappointed when she stepped inside Bryn Helen.

"It's exactly how you'd hope it would look," Mandy says.

Aled and Mandy are impressed with the house's decor. Elegant and classy, the Georgian element is obvious throughout with colours and furniture chosen to reflect the house's past.



From the bold to the classic, **Dan Do** which will be shown on **Wednesday 13 July at 8.25** is certainly a feast for the eyes.
