Another chance to join six celebrities on their journey to learn Welsh

Back in the spring, six celebrities started on an unforgettable journey to learn Welsh – and there will be a chance to re-live their highlights on **Iaith Ar Daith: Uchafbwyntiau** (Welsh Road trip: Highlights) on S4C.

The six intrepid celebs were Rev. Kate Bottley, extreme athlete Richard Parks, comedian Mike Bubbins, *Casualty* actor Amanda Henderson, DJ Katie Owens and *Strictly* star Amy Dowden.

With just one day of lessons with Aran Jones of Say Something in Welsh and an online course, the six were ready to go. But each of the celebs had a friend to help them and to set some challenges along the way.

Sports presenter Jason Mohammad kept Kate company; ultra-marathon runner Lowri Morgan was Richard's mentor; comedian Elis James kept Mike on the right track; DJ Huw Stephens kept Katie company; singer Aled Jones was Amy's mentor and the actor Mali Harries joined Amanda on her journey.

In this special programme we are reminded of the different reasons each celebrity had for learning Welsh.

Kate said: "One of the main reasons I'm learning Welsh is, to be honest, I'm ashamed that I can say 'hello' and 'thank you' in Greek, Spanish, Italian and French but I can't speak Welsh and Wales is just over there! It's an important language."

Richard felt that there was something missing in his life and that something was speaking Welsh and in Katie's case, she was keen to learn the language because she wanted to understand the words to Welsh songs.

Mike said: "There's no excuse not to speak Welsh if you live in Wales. It's a part of the culture and something that gives us identity as a country."

There will also be a chance to enjoy some of the adventures experienced by the celebs and their well-known friends – who could forget Amy and Aled driving diggers; Kate and Jason learning some dance moves and Mike and Elis driving tractors on the Pembrey racetrack?

On the last morning of each road trip there was a big test facing each celeb – the media challenge.



We can once again enjoy seeing Richard appear in the soap opera Rownd a Rownd; Amanda Henderson giving camping tips on magazine programme Prynawn Da and Katie Owens presenting a show on Radio Cymru.

In **Iaith Ar Daith: Uchafbwyntiau** on Sunday, 14 August we are reminded how much the road trip meant to the learners and many tears are shed as our brilliant learners each receive a personal poem written for them by some of Wales's best-known poets to celebrate their unforgettable journeys.
